## ARTEMIS SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Artemis is a domestic violence resource agency located at 310 W. Monument Ave. in Dayton. Many women and their children go there with very little. WOE-R has decided to collect school supplies, such as notebook paper, pencils, crayons, glue and backpacks. Of special need now are backpacks, page dividers for notebooks, flash drives and non-perishable food (peanut butter, pasta, tomato sauce, canned goods and Tuna Helper). Nancy Mullins delivers the supplies to the agency. WOE-R members are encouraged to take supplies to the monthly meetings for delivery.

The **Purpose** is to maintain professional contact with the education community of public schools and the professional associations, specifically WOE, through utilization of the expertise and knowledge of retired educators.

## FCPE

Many of us contributed to the Fund for Children and Public Education while working. This fund is used primarily to support OEA's recommendations for candidates that are friendly toward public educational issues. While contributing to FCPE is totally voluntary, members are encouraged to contribute to the Fund. During the 2016-17 year, each time a WOE-R member contributes at least \$10 to FCPE at a regular monthly meeting, a card will be completed with the person's name. At the end of the June 2017 meeting, one of the cards will be drawn. The person will receive a Mexican dinner for up to four people, donated by Sophia Rodriguez and Phil A. Long. Date, time and location will be decided among those involved. **NOTE:** At the September meeting, \$182 was collected for the FCPE. In October, members contributed \$138.

## **OEA NEW EDUCATOR CAMPAIGN**

According to the Ohio Education Association (OEA), 2 million new educators will be hired over the next five years. As a result, OEA is leading the New Educator Engagement, Recruitment and Support Campaign. OEA has an opportunity to recruit and engage 10,000 new educators statewide. This year OEA plans to use one-on-one conversations to build strong relationships with the next generation of educators and provide them with the support they need to succeed. The top reason new educators leave the profession in the first five years is that they do not feel supported, so OEA wants to help new educators make the transition and become successful. Retirees play an important role in this process, and OEA is encouraging them to make time to visit one-on-one with new educators in their district. Talk to them, welcome them and let them know you want to support them and are interested in learning what you can do to make them successful.

## **INTERGENERATIONAL MENTORSHIP**

The Intergenerational Mentor Program has been extended one year to collect and prepare data. A \$10,000 budget from OEA and NEA has been granted for training mentors. Retirees are needed to serve as mentors for college students in the field of education.
