Traditionally, at our December meeting, this group has collected food for various food pantries. This year, our donations will go to: Daybreak Dayton. For more information: http://daybreakdayton.org/Daybreak has four main functions:

- 1. Shelter Daybreak operates the region's only emergency shelter, open 24/7, for youth ages 10 to 20. Daybreak provides shelter, food, clothing, counseling, safety, and stability to more than 300 youth each year.
- 2. Housing Daybreak's housing program is the region's only program designed to move homeless youth ages 18 to 24 out of homelessness, poverty, under-education, and crisis and into housing, financial independence, educational achievement, and self-sufficiency.
- 3. Outreach Daybreak's street outreach program serves youth ages 18 to 24 who are couch-hopping, living on the street, or staying in an adult shelter. Daybreak provides these youth with food, a place to shower and do laundry, hygiene items, and case management while helping them find a safe place to live.
- 4. Employment Daybreak's employment program helps Daybreak youth develop the skills necessary to get and keep jobs. In addition, youth have the opportunity to participate in Supported Employment, Individual Placement and Support programming to find the best match for their employment preferences. Lindy's Bakery, Daybreak's gourmet dog treat bakery and transitional job program, provides Daybreak youth with the opportunity to gain valuable work experience in a supportive environment.

### Portage County EADD Unit B Needs Your Help!

**Who We Are:** We are a 20 member unit of Service and Support Administrators (SSA's) for the Portage County Board of Developmental Disabilities. We provide coordination and authorization of services that ensure the health and welfare of citizens with developmental disabilities in the county. We serve nearly 700 citizens, and many of their families, county-wide.

Why We're Taking a Stand: The SSA's have not had a cost of living increase in pay for 10 years. We have attempted to work with the DD Board for over a year to negotiate a fair and reasonable contract to no avail. Instead, the Board demands that we accept another 3 years with no increases, despite steeply rising employee health care costs and increasing workloads. The Board is currently operating with over a \$20 million budget surplus, and the Board has told us, "We have plenty of money, just not for you."
