-TWO IMPORTANT ISSUES FOR ALL RETIREES TO CONSIDER THIS NOVEMBER-

CITIZENS NOT POLITICIANS Constitutional Amendment

When politicians draw biased, ridiculously shaped voting districts to favor their own interests, it's called gerrymandering, and Ohio is one of the 10 most gerrymandered states. Ohio politicians even recently implemented voting districts the Supreme Court ruled unconstitutional.

The Citizens Not Politicians Amendment will end gerrymandering by empowering citizens, not politicians, to draw fair districts using an open and transparent process. It will:

- Create the 15-member Ohio Citizens Redistricting Commission made up of Democratic, Republican, and Independent citizens who broadly represent the different geographic areas and demographics of the state.
- Ban current or former politicians, political party officials and lobbyists from sitting on the Commission.
- Require fair and impartial districts by making it unconstitutional to draw voting districts that discriminate against or favor any political party or individual politician.
- Require the commission to operate under an open and independent process.

RAISE THE WAGE Constitutional Amendment

Raising Ohio's minimum wage to \$15 per hour by 2026 will benefit nearly 1 million working Ohioans (19% of the Ohio workforce). This includes 470,000 currently paid less than \$15 who will receive a direct benefit, and 500,000 currently paid up to \$17.25, who will get a raise as employers adjust their pay scales. Raising the minimum wage will generate \$2 billion in new annual earnings by 2026.

The average affected worker will take home an additional \$2,128 each year. That's \$3,400 for the lowest-paid Ohioans who will see a direct increase, and \$1,911 for those already paid a little more, who will get a boost too as their employers boost pay scales. Three in five of the people whose pay will go up are women. Raising the wage will reduce gender pay inequity.

White workers make up the largest share of people who will benefit (70%). But for reasons related to structural racism, Black and Latine workers are more often pushed into low-paid jobs, so disproportionately large shares of those groups will benefit (30% of each). The same is true for workers grouped under "other races": 33% of them will get a raise.

Most affected workers are adults aged 20+ (80%); the same share (80%) have already finished high school. More parents will benefit from the ballot measure than teens.
